



National Black Police Association Statement – 13th July 2026

The National Black Police Association welcomes the Government's announcement of additional investment to help protect Jewish communities. Everyone has the right to live, work and worship free from fear, and the rise in antisemitic attacks is a stark reminder of the harm that hate can cause.

This announcement also underlines the importance of robust hate crime legislation and the recording of hate-related incidents. Understanding the nature and scale of hate enables policing and government to identify emerging risks, direct resources where they are needed most, and better protect those who are most vulnerable.

At the same time, we have also seen a concerning rise in anti-Muslim hatred and racist hate crime, with many Black, Asian and minority ethnic communities experiencing increasing hostility, intimidation and violence. These trends remind us that hatred in all its forms must be confronted with equal determination.

We hope this investment reflects a continued commitment to protecting all communities affected by hate. Whether someone is targeted because of their faith, race or ethnicity, they should have confidence that they will be supported, protected and able to live their lives free from fear. That is the standard we should all aspire to. We hope to see further funding and a similar commitment to tackling all hate and division in society.
